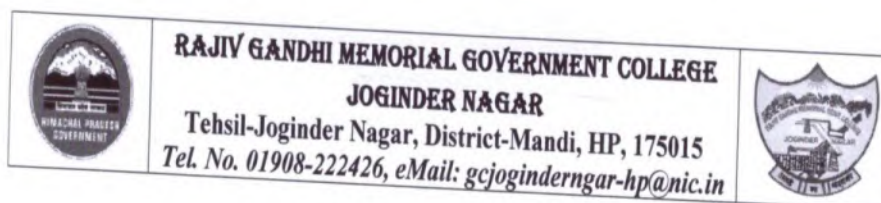

About the Institution

It all began with a small group of committed and dedicated philanthropists led by Colonel (Retd.) Ganga Ram Jamwal who had nothing but a strong will and determination to introduce an institution of higher learning. It was the time when students had no other options but to move to SD College Baijnath (Now PSR GC Baijnath) or Govt. College Mandi or MLSM Sunder Nagar or DAV Kangra or Govt. College Dharamshala if they had to pursue higher studies. Therefore, this group wanted to illuminate the ignorant world of humble people living at grassroot level that neither had resources nor will they be sending their children to far off places for higher learning. Then they collected a meager fund of Rs 20,000/- and anyhow the college was made functional at a small match box factory. It all happened in 1989. On 4th May 1994 the college was taken over by the government and was shifted to the present building in 1999. And today even after 32 years of consistent efforts, we proudly claim to have an institution catering to the needs of around 2000 students with high female ratio and indomitable spirit to achieve more. It is affiliated to Sardar Patel University Mandi and is located on the foothills of Dhauladhar Range of Himalaya's with lush green vegetation and fertile land. The NH-154 and narrow-gauge railway station Joginder Nagar are at a stone's throw away from the college. The college campus is spread over 5 acres area of land, connected with road facility, surrounded by civil hospital, mini secretariat, and playground and in the vicinity of agricultural land. It is located at a distance of 57 kms from Mandi district headquarter. The college is included under Section 2(F) & 12(B) of UGC Act 1956. The college is free from noise and air pollution. There is a peaceful and serene academic oriented atmosphere in the college campus with co-educational system. The college is catering to the needs of rural and backward areas providing quality education. It has progressed by leaps and bounds witnessing several landmarks during its journey towards excellence in last 32 years.

1. Mode of Teaching

i. Lecture Method Only

All the faculty of the college use traditional instructional approach of teaching where the teacher delivers a verbal presentation of the subject matter with the help of traditional chalk and blackboard for demonstration. It also includes question and answer sessions, discussions or problem-solving activities.

ii. Technology Based Teaching Only

Following the rapid advancement of technology in education, the college is equipped with two smart classrooms—one in Room No. 102 and the other in Room No. 201, which also serves as a computer lab. In addition, five interactive panels are available in Physics Theatre-II, Botany Theatre-II, Chemistry Theatre-II, Room No. 203 (Geography), Room No. 303 (Commerce), as well as the Botany Seminar Hall and the BCA Lab, which is also equipped with an overhead projector, to cater to diverse learning styles and needs.

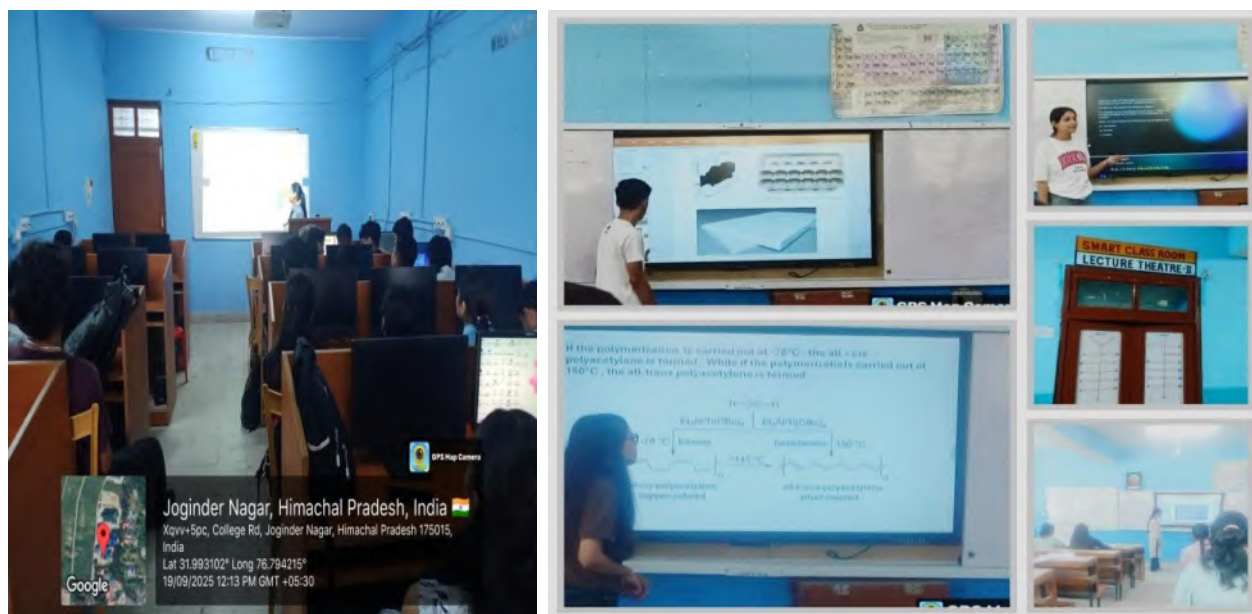
These technology-enabled classrooms combine the features of a traditional whiteboard with the versatility of touch-screen digital tools, allowing teachers to present and interact with digital content during lessons. Teacher **regularly use these tools such as PowerPoint presentations, e-boards, visual data displays, animations, and video streaming to enrich their teaching practices.** The integration of these resources significantly enhances instructional effectiveness and contributes to a dynamic, engaging, and learner-centered classroom environment.

iii. Flipped Classroom

The flipped classroom approach reverses the conventional teaching model by shifting initial content delivery outside the classroom and reserving class time for deeper engagement with the material. In this method, students first explore new topics at home through reading materials, videos, or other digital resources. When they come to class, the time is used for discussions, clarifying doubts, collaborative problem-solving, and applying concepts through activities.

Teachers of the college incorporate elements of the flipped classroom approach in teaching learning. They provide students with learning materials such as videos, PowerPoint presentations, or online articles to review before class. For instance, some faculty members create their own educational videos and upload them to platforms like YouTube. These videos are then shared with students as **pre-class learning resources.** In the classroom, the teacher focuses on interactive discussion and application of the concepts introduced in the assigned materials.

The photographs show students actively engaged in peer discussion and concept explanation during classroom sessions. These activities take place after students have reviewed learning materials shared in advance — an essential component of the flipped classroom approach. In this model, class time is utilized for interactive learning, collaborative problem-solving, and deeper understanding of the topics covered earlier by students on their own.





iv. As Per Need of Different Groups of Students

Remedial classes in the college are designed to help students with different needs and expectations. These classes focus on improving students skills in their respective subjects. The objective of remedial classes to bridge the gap between a student's current academic skills and expectation of course he/she opted for. Besides, Career Counseling and academic guidance is also provided to students in aligning their studies with long term career goals and help them develop time management, organization and study skills.



2. Curriculum Planning and Implementation

i. Teaching Schedule

The college prepares a detailed teaching schedule for each course in accordance with the guidelines prescribed by Sardar Patel University. This schedule outlines the systematic distribution of the syllabus across the academic session to ensure timely and comprehensive curriculum coverage. All faculty members strictly adhere to the prescribed teaching plan, maintaining uniformity and academic discipline across departments. Regular monitoring by the Heads of Departments ensures that classes are conducted as planned and that any deviations are promptly addressed. This structured approach not only enhances teaching effectiveness but also ensures that students benefit from well-organized and consistent academic delivery.

ii. Whether Learning Outcomes Defined

All the Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) for various programmes offered by the institution including B.A. (English, Hindi, Political Science, Economics, Geography, History, Sociology, Public Administration, Sanskrit, Music, Education and Physical Education), BSC, BCA, BBA, BCOM as well as postgraduate programmes such as **M.A. English and M.A. Economics** are already provided on the official college website (<https://www.gcjogindernagar.in/page/programmeoutcomes.html>). These outcomes are formally documented and made accessible to all stakeholders for reference and academic planning.

These Programme Specific Outcomes guide the teaching–learning processes and are consistently followed by faculty members while preparing course plans, instructional materials and evaluation methods. The availability of these outcomes on the website ensures transparency, facilitates student awareness and supports the institution's commitment to maintaining academic quality and accountability.

iii. Curriculum Enrichment Practices

During the academic year 2024–25, the college undertook several curriculum enrichment initiatives aimed at enhancing students' academic competence, cultural awareness, practical exposure, and research skills. These activities were conducted under four major categories: Surveys, Educational Tours, Industrial Visits, and Project Work.

A. Surveys

To encourage experiential learning and develop analytical skills, students participated in survey-based academic activities during the session. These surveys enabled students to collect field data, interact with local communities, and apply classroom concepts to real-life contexts. The findings from these surveys contributed to class discussions and academic assignments, thereby enriching the learning process.

B. Educational Tours

The college organized multiple educational tours to broaden students' understanding of cultural heritage, museum studies, and historical architecture.

a. Educational Tour to Kerala and Mumbai (12–20 Feb 2025)

An educational tour to Kerala and Mumbai was conducted from **12 Feb to 20 Feb 2025**. A total of **35 students** participated, accompanied by **Dr. Kuldeep** and **Mr. Naveen Nischal Sood**, who served as faculty coordinators. Students visited various cultural and educational institutions.

b. Educational Tour to Chamba

A separate educational tour to **Chamba** was organized in the month of Oct, 2024 to expose students to the region's cultural and architectural heritage. **Ms. Shivani** was deputed as the faculty coordinator. Students visited significant historical monuments and museums, which enriched their understanding of regional art and heritage conservation.



C. Industrial Visit

Industrial Visit to Mandi, Himachal Pradesh (29 November 2024)

On **29 November 2024**, an industrial visit was organized to an industrial unit located in **Mandi, Himachal Pradesh**. The coordinators were **Dr. Kuldeep Singh** and **Dr. Samriti Thakur**, who accompanied **31 students**. The visit provided hands-on exposure to industrial operations and processes, enabling students to integrate theoretical knowledge with practical experience.



Industrial Visit to Govt. Ayurvedic Pharmacy Joginder Nagar (20 November 2024)

On 20 November 2024, a visit was conducted to the Govt. Ayurvedic Pharmacy, Joginder Nagar, Distt. Mandi, Himachal Pradesh. 25 students were accompanied by two staff teachers: Dr. Atul and Smt. Aarti Sharma, Assistant Professor of Chemistry from RGM Govt. College Joginder Nagar.

Visit to CSIR-Institute of Himalayan Bioresource Technology (IHBT)

A research-oriented trip to the CSIR-Institute of Himalayan Bioresource Technology (IHBT) in Palampur, offering exposure to cutting-edge Himalayan biotechnology and sustainable bioeconomy research.



D. Project Work

As part of the curriculum enrichment initiatives, students also undertook **project-based work** during the session. These projects encouraged independent learning, critical thinking, and application of subject knowledge. Students carried out topic-specific investigations under faculty supervision, and their findings were evaluated as part of the assessment process. The project work significantly contributed to enhancing research aptitude and problem-solving skills among students.

iv. Internal Assessment Mechanism (Quizzes, Class tests, Presentations, Assignments, MTTs etc.)

The internal assessment mechanism for undergraduate students of the college is defined by the Sardar Patel University in the syllabus which includes: Continuous Comprehensive Assessment: This Accounts for the 30% of the final grade for a course. It comprises of Mid Term Examination, Class Test, Assignment/ Seminars and Attendance.

End Semester Examination: This account for 70% of final grade for a course. Students are briefed with Internal Assessment and Evaluation Mechanism at the very outset to enhance transparency and to make them well aware of the mechanism adopted for evaluation. The respective teachers evaluate the answer books of class test, assignments and project Reports. The assessment is shown and discussed in the classes. The Students will be provided feedback on their mistakes and suggestions for improving their performance. The final internal assessment is uploaded by the teachers on the university portal in accordance with the guidelines of Himachal Pradesh University. The whole process is objective and devoid of any bias.

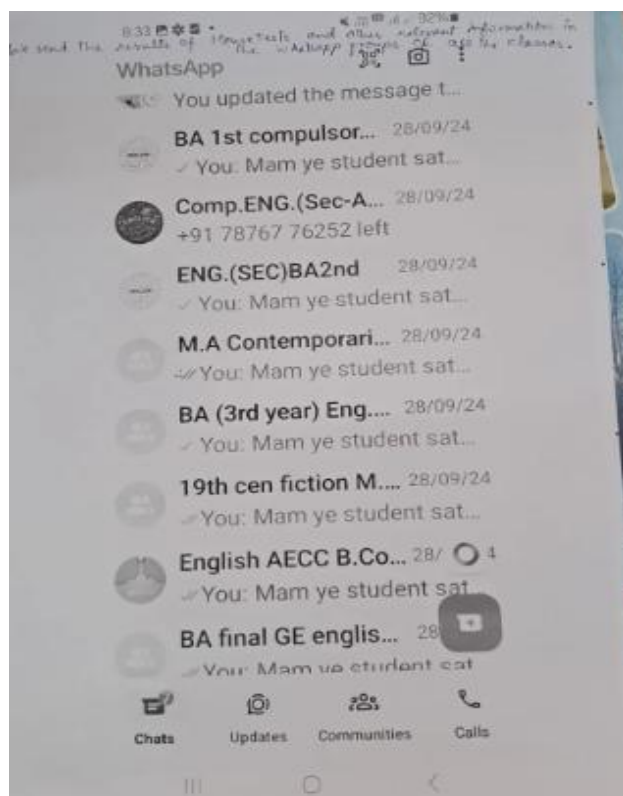
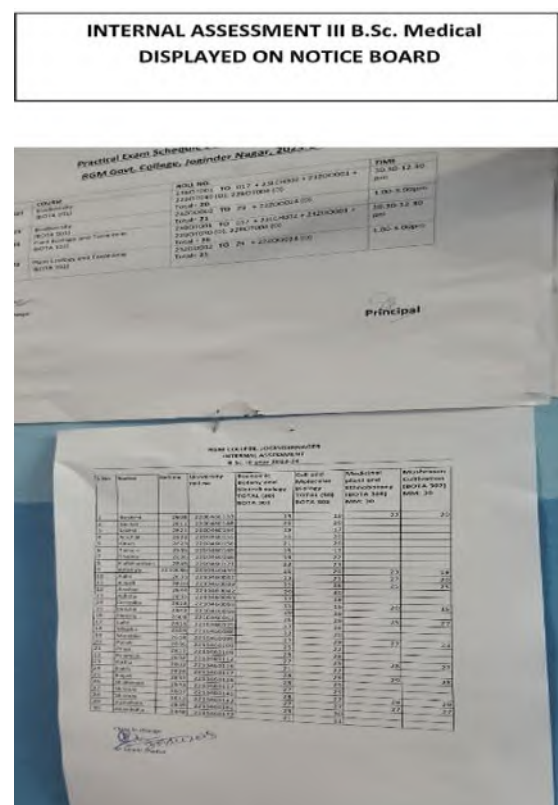

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v. Prompt Communication of Assessment/Results to Students

The college is committed to maintaining transparency and accessibility in communicating students' academic performance. Examination results and Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) marks are regularly displayed on the college notice board. Additionally, subject teachers share the results with students through class WhatsApp groups, facilitating swift communication and easy access. By utilizing both online and offline platforms, the college ensures that students receive timely and transparent updates on their academic progress.



3. Add-on Courses/Certificate Courses

No add-on or certificate courses were conducted during the session 2024–25.

4. Student feedback (taken from students with 80% attendance):

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college has established a comprehensive feedback mechanism and framework to evaluate the institution's performance across various domains. For the academic session 2024-25, the IQAC conducted a student survey using a Google feedback form to assess and uphold the quality of teaching. Responses were collected from students who maintained at least 80% attendance, providing valuable insights into the teaching-learning process. The collected data was systematically analyzed to identify areas of strength and opportunities for further enhancement in instructional quality.

i. Sample Size

A representative sample of 519 students, constituting more than 25% of the total student population, was selected to provide feedback for the student survey. This sample size was chosen to ensure a comprehensive and accurate reflection of student perspectives on the teaching-learning experience.

The responses collected via Google Forms were analyzed to gain valuable insights into various aspects of academic quality and institutional effectiveness.

Curriculum Coverage

In response to the question on syllabus completion, 42.2% of students reported that 85–100% of the syllabus was covered, while 44.7% indicated 70–84% coverage. A smaller proportion reported moderate or low coverage. Overall, the results suggest that the majority of courses were completed satisfactorily within the stipulated academic period.

Teaching Preparation and Delivery

Regarding teachers' preparedness, 63% of students rated the preparation as satisfactory, and 24.9% rated it as thorough. Only a negligible percentage expressed dissatisfaction. This reflects a strong level of faculty commitment and effective classroom planning.

Teaching Effectiveness and Learning Experience

Across the remaining questions, students provided largely positive feedback on:

- Clarity of explanation
- Subject knowledge of teachers
- Use of teaching aids and examples
- Interaction and doubt clarification
- Pace and organization of lectures

Most responses fell in the good to excellent range, indicating that teaching methodologies were effective and student-centered.

Assessment and Academic Support

Students expressed satisfaction with:

- Fairness and transparency of internal assessments
- Timely conduct of tests and assignments
- Constructive feedback on performance

Academic support mechanisms such as mentoring and guidance were also rated positively.

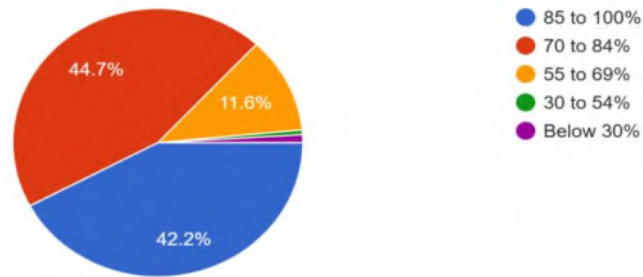
Overall Satisfaction

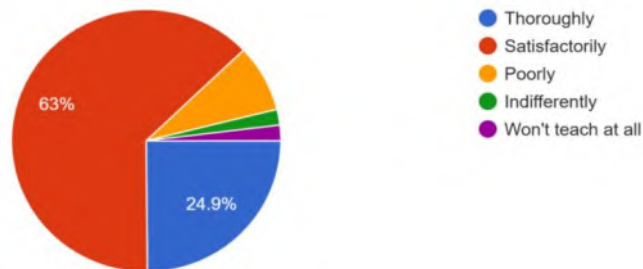
1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

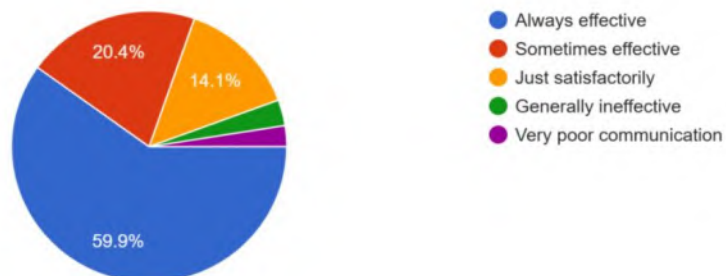

ii. Students' Satisfaction

Student feedback during the academic session 2024–25 indicated a high level of satisfaction with the initiatives undertaken to enhance learning, professional exposure, and overall student development. The institution organized several programmes in collaboration with internal departments and external organizations, which contributed positively to students' academic and career preparedness.

Based on the feedback received from students regarding academic support, career guidance, campus facilities, health awareness, and overall well-being, the College Administration, through various committees and cells, implemented the following actions during the **academic session 2024–25**:

a) Career Awareness Programme – 12 August 2024

A career awareness programme was organized in association with the Department of Commerce and the Institute of Company Secretaries of India (New Delhi and Shimla Chapter). Mr. Ashutosh Thakur, an alumnus of the college, delivered a lecture on the role and future prospects of becoming a Company Secretary. A total of 154 students participated and gained valuable insights into professional pathways in commerce and corporate governance.

b) One-Day Career Counseling Lecture – 24 August 2024

A career counseling session and scholarship test were conducted in collaboration with AIMS Academy, Joginder Nagar. Ninety-four students attended the programme, which provided personalized guidance on academic planning and career choices.

c) Motivational Session – 11 September 2024

A motivational talk titled “Unleashing Your Potential for Success” was organized in association with Perfect Institute, Joginder Nagar. The session focused on developing students' self-confidence, goal-setting, and leadership skills. A total of 148 students participated and actively engaged in discussions.

d) Seminar on Career Opportunities – 13 September 2024

A seminar on career opportunities in HCL Technology was conducted to familiarize students with industry trends and professional roles. Mr. Kanik Mandhotra, State Lead, Haryana Tech Bee, guided students on emerging career prospects. This event provided exposure to the technology sector and practical insights into recruitment processes.

e) Recruitment Interaction – 4 October 2024

HCL Technology conducted a recruitment drive for students of BCA, BSc IT, and BSc Mathematics. One student was successfully selected as a trainee, highlighting the institution's efforts to facilitate industry connections and real-world employment opportunities.

f) Webinar on Financial Literacy – 24 October 2024

A webinar titled "Smart Investor Awareness Program" was organized in collaboration with SEBI and NSDL. Eighty-seven students participated and received guidance on financial planning, investment strategies, and the fundamentals of the stock market.

g) Financial Literacy Workshop – 28 November 2024

The workshop was conducted in collaboration with the Department of Commerce and Earth Nirmat NGO, Mumbai. Mr. Saleem Khan, ex-defence personnel and former Director of ICAI, served as the resource person. A total of 114 students and faculty attended. An MoU was signed with Earth Nirmat, and 40 students were shortlisted for their Career Acceleration Programme.

h) Higher Education Seminar – 25 February 2025

A seminar on higher education in India was organized with Chitkara University, Chandigarh. One hundred thirteen students participated and received guidance on postgraduate opportunities, admission procedures, and academic pathways for future studies.

i) On-Campus Placement Drive – 25 October 2024

A placement drive was conducted with Glacial Adventures India Pvt. Ltd. Thirty-eight students participated, and one student was selected as a Sales Executive. The drive offered students practical exposure to recruitment processes and workplace expectations.

j) Job Fair – 7 March 2025

A campus job fair featured three companies providing over 700 vacancies. A total of 160 students registered, and 104 were selected by organizations including Joobocah.com, Pie-soft Informatics (Chandigarh), Glacial Adventures Pvt. Ltd., Earth Nirmat NGO (Mumbai), and HCL Technologies (Noida). The fair significantly enhanced students' employment prospects and practical understanding of the job market.

In addition to these initiatives, the institution has undertaken further measures to support student development:

- **Formation of Mentor-Mentee Groups:** Mentor-mentee groups have been established to provide personalized guidance and foster supportive academic relationships.
- **Installation of an Outdoor Gymnasium:** To promote physical well-being and encourage productive use of leisure time, an outdoor gymnasium has been installed on campus.
- **Cleanliness of Washrooms and Classrooms:** In response to student feedback, regular cleaning and sanitation schedules have been implemented for classrooms and washrooms. Monitoring mechanisms have been strengthened to ensure a clean, hygienic, and conducive learning environment.
- **Stress Management and Mental Well-being:** Stress management and mental health awareness programmes have been organized to help students cope with academic pressure, improve time management skills, and enhance emotional resilience.

- **Anti-Drug Awareness Initiatives:** Anti-drug awareness programmes, including awareness talks, campaigns, and pledge activities, have been conducted to sensitize students about the harmful effects of substance abuse and to maintain the campus as a drug-free zone.


These initiatives underscore the institution's commitment to enhancing the quality of education, fostering a dynamic learning environment, and preparing students to excel in their academic and professional pursuits.

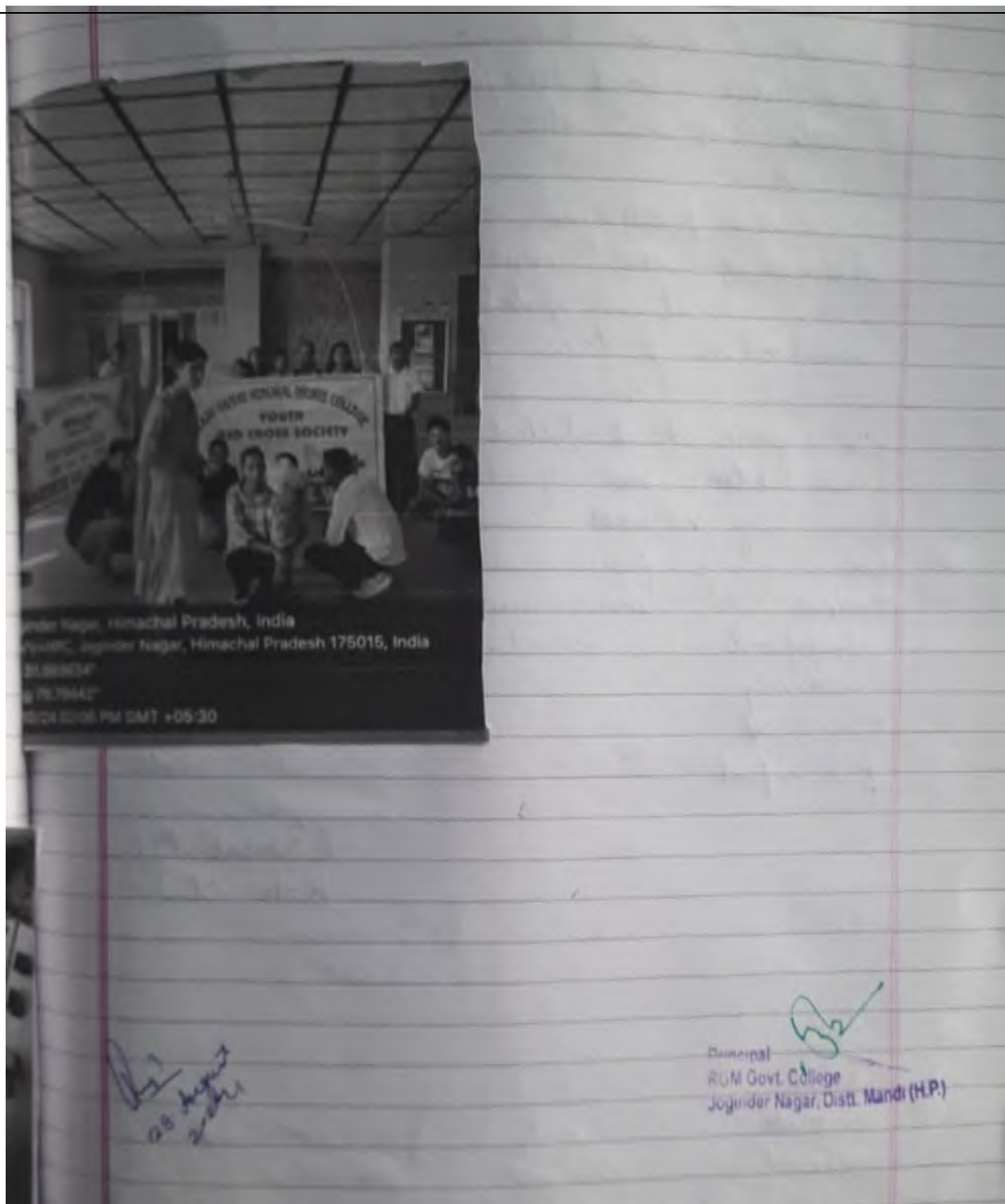
AIDS Day was celebrated with great awareness and enthusiasm to spread knowledge about HIV/AIDS, reduce stigma and support those living with the condition.

The Context

There has been a close relationship between nature and mankind since the inception of humanity and there has to be a harmony between the two. Environmental issues are such that they affect every living being. These issues are related to different aspects of life as these issues basically deal with the existence of life and sustainability of resources and the earth itself. Our religious scriptures also highlight the importance of nature and therefore it has always been worshipped. We have been using and thus exploiting nature to such an extent that environmental degradation is a major threat today. After industrial revolution the pace of resource exploitation and consumption has also increased to cater to the needs of increasing population. Consequently, there has been greater use of fertilizer and pesticides leading to pollution. Therefore, there is an urgent need to conserve natural

resources for the survival of future generations. Green Practices help the college to stand out as a role model in environment conservation for the students who are the future of our country. In this context the college has adopted the following practices:

1. Solar Panels & Solar Lights
2. Rain water harvesting Tanks
3. Vermi Compost Pitt
4. Plantation Drive by NCC/NSS/RR
5. Eco Club Formation

The Practice

Solar Panels & Solar Lights

We know that sun is the ultimate source of energy on the earth. India being a tropical country, sun light is available in abundance. Vertical solar radiation is available almost throughout the year and we need to harness and utilize this energy. Understanding the need to tap this resource, the college has set up solar panels and solar lights at key points in the campus. The solar lights illuminate the college at night and also help in educating students about how electric energy can be saved for the country.

- Solar panels with better capacity were installed in the Administrative block in 2024.



Rain water harvesting Tanks

Life has been possible on earth due to water. Water that we use comes to us through water cycle. The water vapours get condensed in the atmosphere and precipitation takes place on the earth surface in the form of rain and snow. The rain water on the earth surface is used in different ways. Most of the water flows through the rivers back to the oceans. We are using this precious resource luxuriously. We are over utilizing surface as well as ground water. So, there is an urgent need to manage this resource and use it judiciously. Accordingly, the rain water harvesting tank, which uses surface runoff harvesting, has been set up to store the rain water and utilize it at a later point. This practice teaches our students how to reduce the consumption of water and how to restore the water table. This water is free from pollutants as well as salts, minerals and other natural and manmade contaminants, and is used for irrigational purpose.



Vermi-Compost Pit

It has been set to emphasize the use of bio-fertilizers and reduce dependence on urea and chemical fertilizers. Waste materials are collected, decomposed and broken down by worms, insects, bacteria, fungi and a dark fertile soil is formed which is called compost. It is mainly the bio degradable material kitchen waste, leaves and branches, human waste which can be used for this. These materials are put in a pit and mixed with soils, leaves etc. Worms, insects etc are introduced deliberately and water is sprinkled on the top to keep it moist. Thus, rich fertile manure is produced.



PLANTATION DRIVE

- The first activity of the Eco Club for the year **2024–25** was the **Plantation Drive** conducted on 17 September 2024.
- Around **30 students of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd year** participated and prepared pits for plantation.
- The plants were **donated by the Herbal Garden, Joginder Nagar** on the occasion of “*Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam*”.
- **Herbs and tree saplings** were planted during the drive.
- Each student **adopted one plant** to take proper care of it.
- The event was **graced by the Regional Director, HRTC Joginder Nagar, Shri Ansh Chauhan**, and his team.
- The guests made students aware of the **botanical names, local names, and uses** of the planted species.
- The **Principal, RGMGC Joginder Nagar**, also accompanied the students and planted a sapling.

Eco-Club

This club of the college creates awareness of environmental issues such as protection, conservation, preservation, and restoration with an emphasis on educating and empowering students. As a result, the students and parents have a deeper understanding of environmental issues and have the wisdom to make informed and responsible decisions. In addition to the various literary activities, awareness programs and lectures, the Eco club organizes actionbased activities like tree plantation and cleanliness drives, grow kitchen gardens, maintain vermin compost pests and rain harvesting tank. The large-scale participation of students shows that they are interested in environmental advocacy and awareness.

The students are sensitized to minimize the use of plastic bags, not to throw them in the public places as they choke drains and sewers, cause water logging and provide breeding ground for mosquitoes. The college organizes tree plantation programs, awareness programs such as quiz, essay, painting competitions, slogan writing, rallies etc. regarding environmental issues and educates them about recycling and reuse of waste material. The students are also sensitized about traffic rules, use of unnecessary horns, and against the use of crackers and fireworks. Field visits to environmentally important sites are held. Indiscriminate burning of waste, which causes air pollution and respiratory diseases, is discouraged. Students are also motivated to imbibe habits and life style of minimum waste generation and distinguish between dry, wet and bio degradable waste. They learn to identify polluting agencies and forward it to the enforcement agencies. The volunteers learn to beautify the college campus and surroundings with plants and flowers and put campaign boards to spread awareness. The students are imbibed with the ethos of conservation of water and develop skills of observation, experimentation, survey and analysis needed for environmental conservation.

The parent feedback reveals that the college is performing well in several key areas, particularly in maintaining discipline, ensuring a safe and comfortable environment for students, and fostering positive behaviour from teachers towards learners. Parents generally appreciate the teaching quality and feel that the institution provides a supportive atmosphere for their children. At the same time, the feedback highlights certain areas where improvement is needed especially in maintaining consistent communication with parents and providing regular updates about students' academic progress. Many parents selected responses such as "Sometimes," indicating that while efforts are being made, the communication system is not uniform for all students. Overall satisfaction ratings averaged around 3.3 out of 5, showing that while parents recognize the institution's strengths, they also expect greater involvement, better academic monitoring, and stronger engagement. Despite

this, the majority of parents expressed willingness to recommend the college to others, reflecting a positive image with room for further enhancement.

Action Taken:

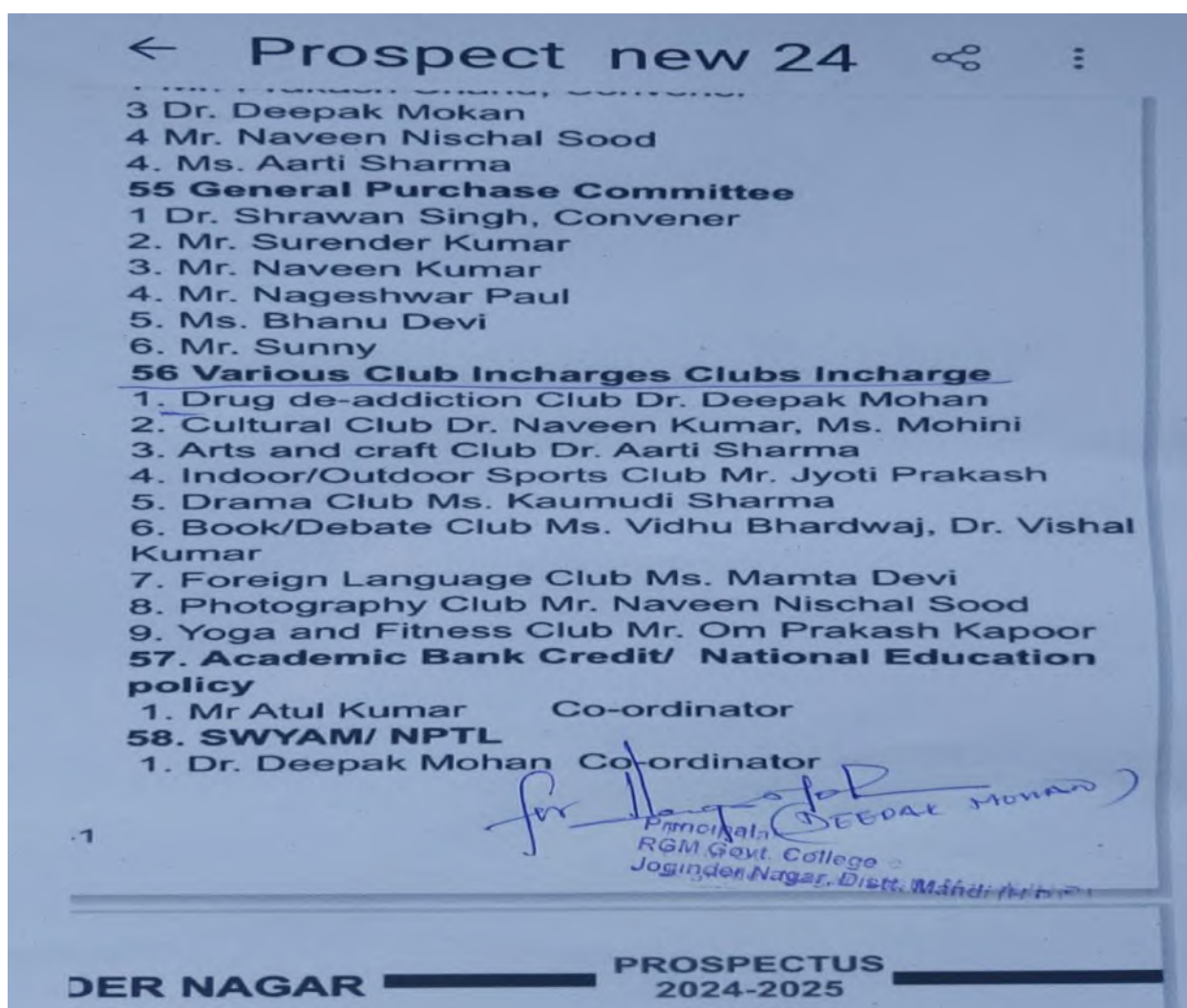
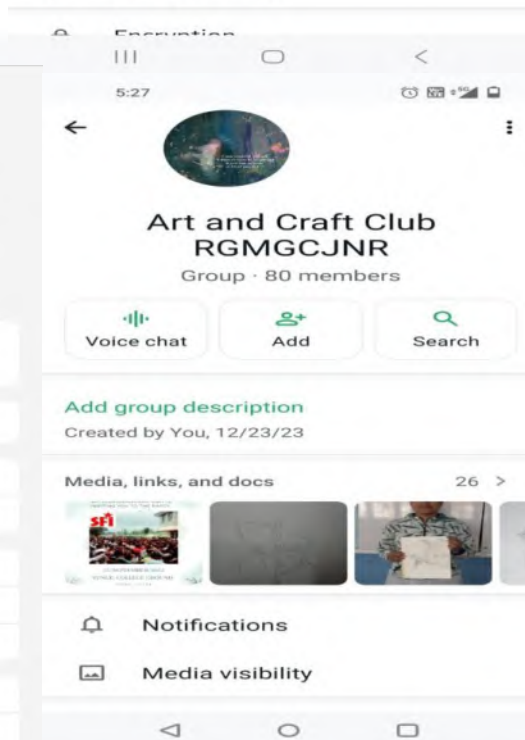
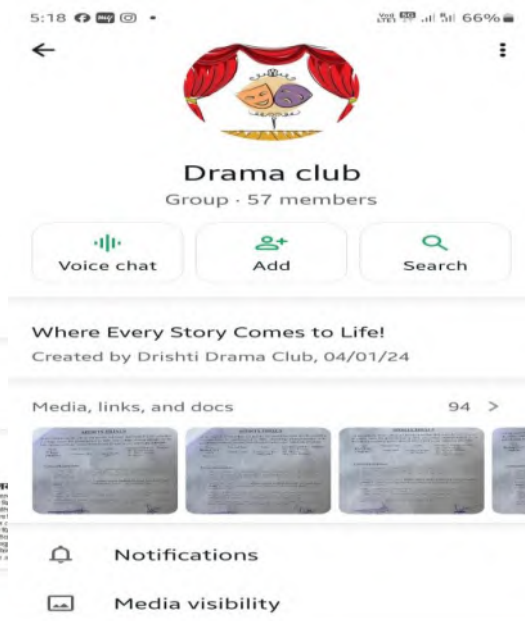
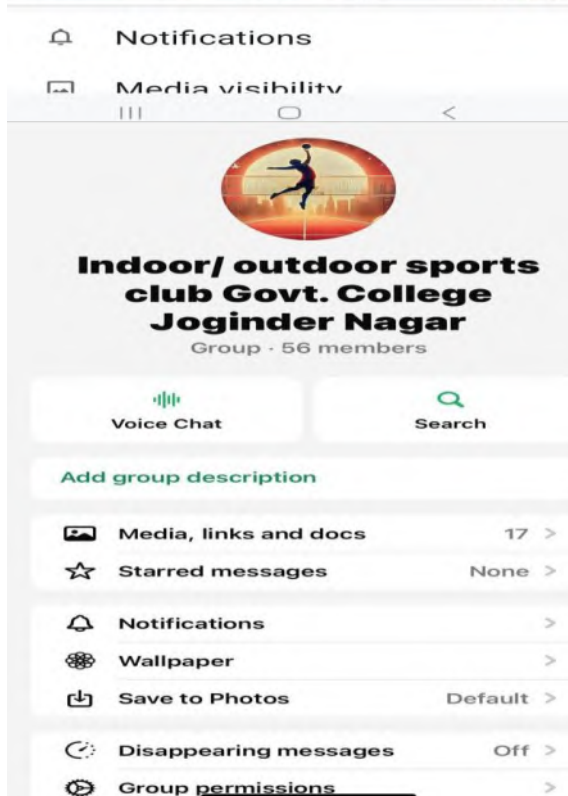
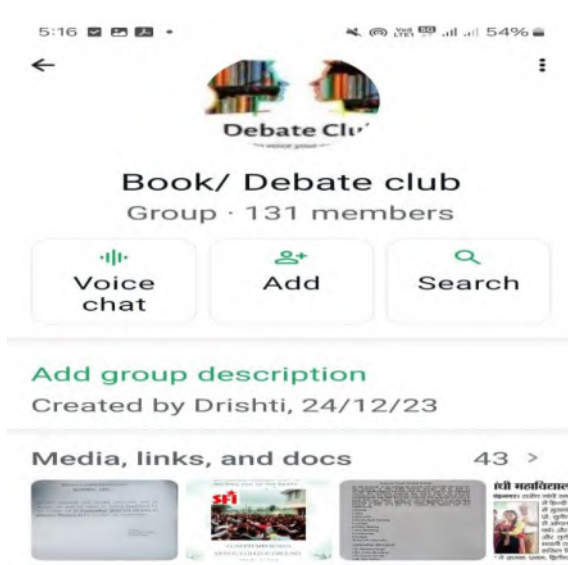
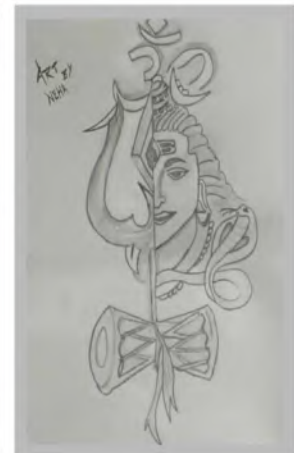
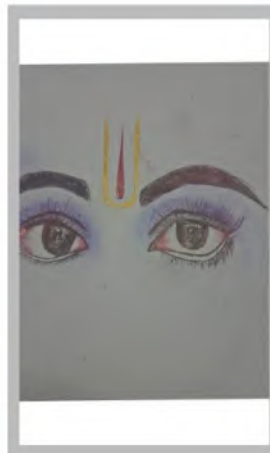
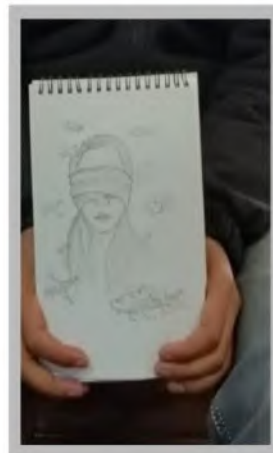
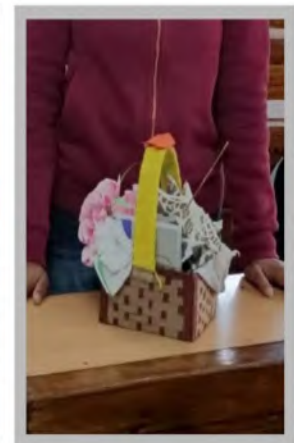
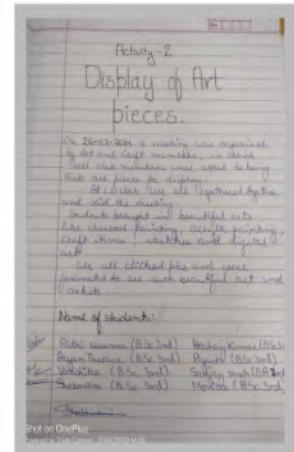
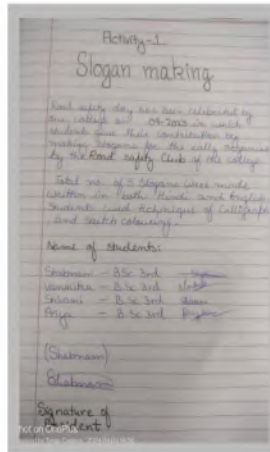
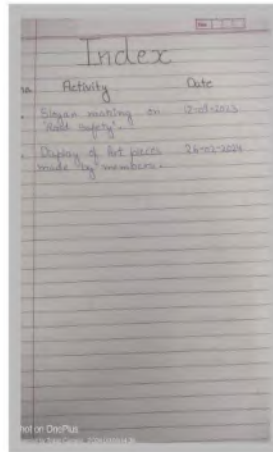
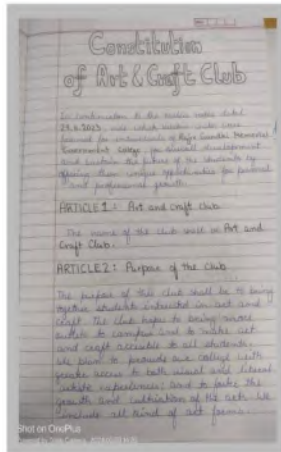
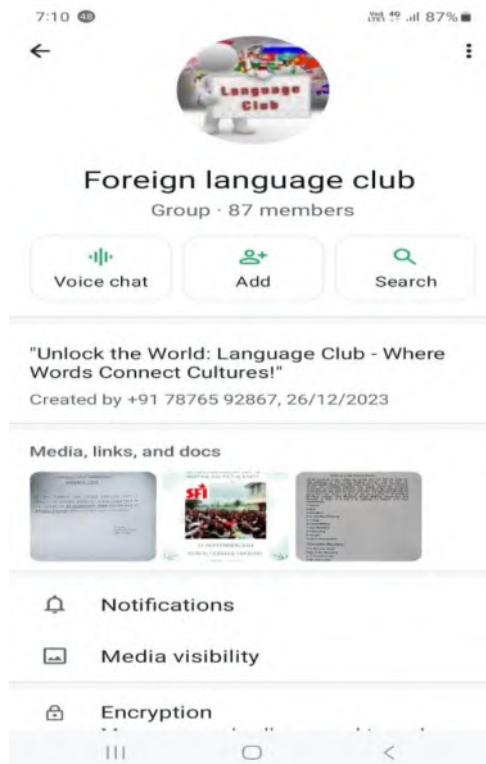
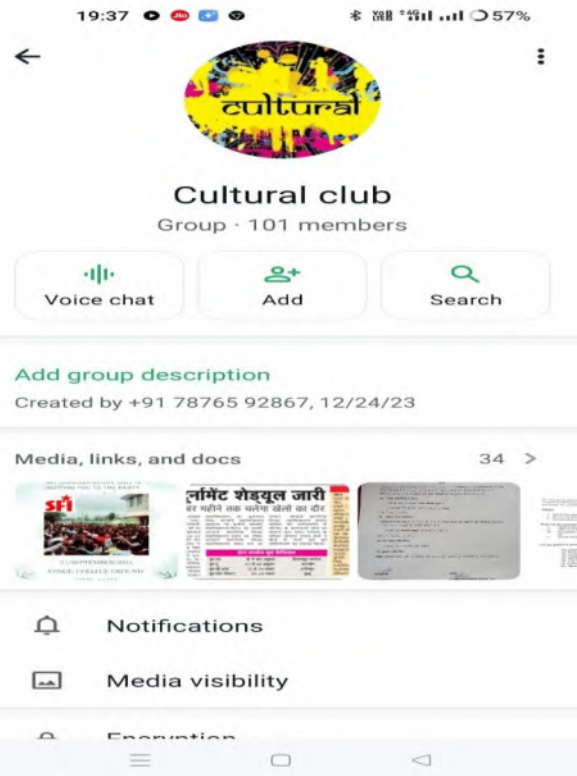


Image: Incharges of Clubs 2024-25

1. Introduction

"We are the first generation to feel the effect of climate change and the last generation who can do something about it"

For the ecosystem to flourish sustainably or for an organization to be eco-friendly, a green audit is necessary. Higher education institutions have been concentrating on academic and infrastructure operations for the previous several decades, which has resulted in required financial audit only. To help HEIs to identify their environmental consequences and evaluate their compliance with relevant rules and regulations, a tool known as a "green audit" has come into the picture. It is a useful tool to determine, where we are using most of energy & water resources and the necessary changes to be implemented for minimizing their use and a self-enquiry of the institution for the sustainable development by reducing carbon footprint and conserving environment. As a part of such practice, green audit is conducted to evaluate the actual scenario at the organization

In compliance with the NAAC criterion, HEIs prepare and analyze green audit report which is also a part of its corporate social responsibility. To ensure that the institution's green legacy is continued, self-assessment is crucial in complete reporting of the institution's green quotient and strategic plan.

About the College: With the towering mountain range as the back drop, Rajiv Gandhi Memorial Govt. College Joginder Nagar was established in May 1994. The college is currently commemorating its 26th year of illustrious academic life. It is affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University Shimla and is located on the foothills of Dhauladhar Range of Himalaya's with lush green vegetation and fertile land. The NH-154 and narrow-gauge railway station JoginderNagar are at a stone's throw away from the college. The college campus is spread over 5 acres area of land, connected with road facility, surrounded by civil hospital, mini secretariat, playground and in the vicinity of agricultural land. It is located at a distance of 57 kms from Mandi district headquarter. The college is included under Section 2(F) & 12(B) of UGC Act 1956. The college is free from noise and air pollution. There is a peaceful and serene academic oriented atmosphere in the college campus with co-educational system. The college is catering to the needs of rural and backward areas by providing quality education.

2. Objectives of Green Audit

The main objectives of Green Audit are as follows:

- To minimize the use of energy, water and other resources by focusing on alternate natural resources
- Role of HEIs in sustainable development of the environment
- Conservation of biodiversity through green campus management
- Self enquiry to reduce carbon footprint
- Proper disposal of waste and its management
- To raise the green quotient of staff and students

3. Methodology

Pre audit stage

The audit team identified the following areas for analysis:

- I. Water auditing
- II. Energy management
- III. Waste management
- IV. Green campus management
- V. Carbon footprint

Audit stage

- I. Preparation and filling up of questionnaire: The team created a questionnaire about green practices followed in college, and 186 responses from students and staff were collected via Google Form. It was quite useful in determining the respondents' level of green consciousness,
- II. In order to gather primary data, the audit team physically inspected the campus, visiting several departments, the library, labs, canteen, administration building, garden, parking lot, multipurpose hall, and garden.
- III. Various documents from the offices and departments were inspected, examined, and gathered.
- IV. The college's principal, staff members, and students were questioned to get their opinions.

Post audit stage

In order to create an audit report with suggestions and a future plan of action, the data gathered from all the resources was combined.

4. Audit report

a. Water Auditing

The college receives water from the Himachal Pradesh Jal Shakti Vibhag, which is used for drinking, sanitation, domestic use, and horticulture. Aside from that, the college campus has a rainwater harvesting tank, and the water saved in it is used for gardening.

There are eight 1000-litre water tanks on the roof of the Arts and Science block, two in the administration block, one in the canteen, and fourteen in the staff quarters. According to the office record of the preceding six months' water bill, the average daily use is roughly 1366 Litres, which covers drinking, sanitation, and some gardening. There is no shortage of water on our college campus because demand and supply are

balanced, as evidenced by a survey in which more than 98 percent of respondents stated that the college had adequate potable drinking water supplies.

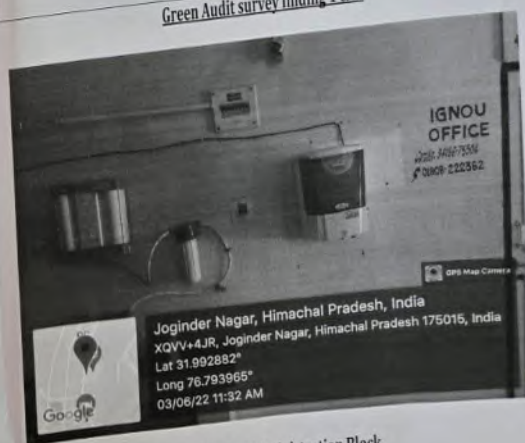
The college has sufficient supply of potable drinking water?

Water purifier in Administration Block

Water is obtained from natural resources, and its physical, chemical, and biological qualities are assessed by the relevant agency prior to distribution. Because higher standard water is required for drinking, therefore three water purifiers and two water coolers are installed for further purification.



Water purifier and coolers

The physico-chemical properties of tap water are analyzed in chemistry laboratory and are compared with BIS acceptable limits. All the parameters are found within the limits and water is found fit for drinking purposes. The analysis report is given below:

The college does not have a water treatment facility, so waste water is discharged into sewage pipes that are connected to the Municipal Corporation's central sewage system.

The drinking water sink pipes have been moved to the gardens, where they are used to irrigate the plants. Our college's water conservation efforts are commendable, as evidenced by the fact that more than 95% of users turn off the tap after each use, and 94% have not discovered any water line leaks.



Rainwater Harvesting Tank

Rain water harvesting is the best traditional method for conservation of water and also for limiting the supply of drinking water for gardening. Rainwater harvesting tank is constructed in the backside of our college campus with a capacity of . The rainwater is collected via the downpipes, which are linked to the tank. Water undergoes primary purification treatment in the tank and is further used for gardening purposes.

b. Energy management

The main consumption of energy is in lighting and running the computer systems. The college has been sanctioned a load of 52 kW from Himachal Pradesh State Electricity Board. The average monthly electricity consumption is 927 units and a bill of Rs 9,475/- is paid for it. Solar panels are an alternative renewable energy source. The college has set up solar panels and solar lights at key points in the campus. The solar lights illuminate the college at night and also help in educating students about how

electric energy can be saved for the country. It can be clearly seen from the following bills that power produced from solar panels is also exported to HPSEBL as there is two grid.

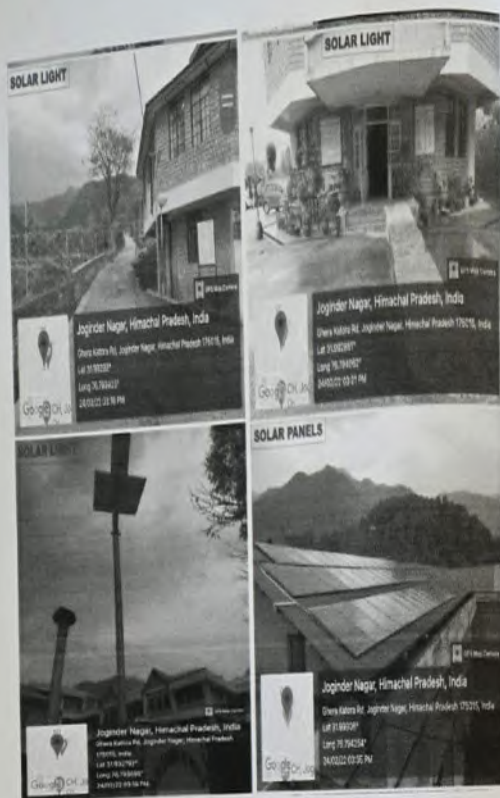

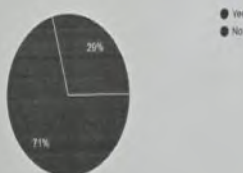

c. Waste Management

The waste generated in the campus is classified as bio degradable and non bio degradable waste which mainly comprises of paper waste, waste from science labs, domestic waste from staff quarters, college canteen and girls' toilets. There are bins for collecting waste in every department and college office. The college campus has blue and green containers for collecting biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste.

respectively. The biodegradable waste that is gathered from bins and the college canteen breaks down in the vermi composting unit and is applied as garden manure. There is no waste treatment facility in the college, thus the municipal council of Joginder Nagar's waste collection vehicle picks up non biodegradable waste and domestic waste from staff quarters. In the girls' toilet, sanitary pad incinerators are installed, which aid in disposing of the sanitary pads in an environmentally friendly manner by burning and turning them into ash. The office and admissions processes are digital, all announcements are distributed to students via the college website, and double-sided printing is used, thus the amount of paper waste produced is minimal.

The liquid waste from Chemistry labs is discharged into the specially designed waste tank, which is located adjacent to the Chemistry laboratory.

E-waste is categorized by respective departments and disposed through auction.

Vermicomposting: It is an eco friendly process that recycles organic waste into compost and produces fertilizer. In our college, a vermi compost pit is built for this purpose and bio degradable waste is decomposed into nutrient rich fertilizer.

d. Green Campus Management

The college campus is immensely diverse with a variety of tree species performing a variety of functions. The trees, herbs and shrubs of the college plays an integral part in improving the quality of life, not only the college fraternity but also the people around of the college in terms of contributing to our environment by providing oxygen, improving air quality, climate amelioration, conservation of water, preserving soil, and supporting wildlife, controlling climate by moderating the effects of the sun, rain and wind. Leaves absorb and filter the sun's radiant energy, keeping things cool in summer. Many species of birds are dependent on these trees mainly for food and shelter. Nectar of flowers and plants is a favourite of birds and many insects. Fruit bearing trees attract variety of insects like wasps, bees, ants and beetles thus increasing the biodiversity. Leaf covered branches keep many animals, such as birds out of reach of predators. Different species display a seemingly endless variety of shapes, forms, texture and vibrant colours. Even individual trees vary their appearance throughout the course of the year as the seasons change. Efforts have been made not to disturb the local flora of the area and most of the trees of the campus are indigenous to the area. A thick belt of large shady trees in the periphery of the college have planted to bring down noise and cut down dust and storms. Thus, the college has been playing a significant role in maintaining the environment of the entire town in its surrounding areas.

In addition to preserve and protect the local biodiversity, many tree species have also been planted in different periods of time through various plantation programmes organised by the authority and have become an integral part of the college along with the native plant species. College has around 70 variety of plants including tree species,

shrubs and herbs. Almost 300 potted ornamental plants also contribute to the beauty and greenery of the campus. List of few plants present in the campus is given in Table 1.

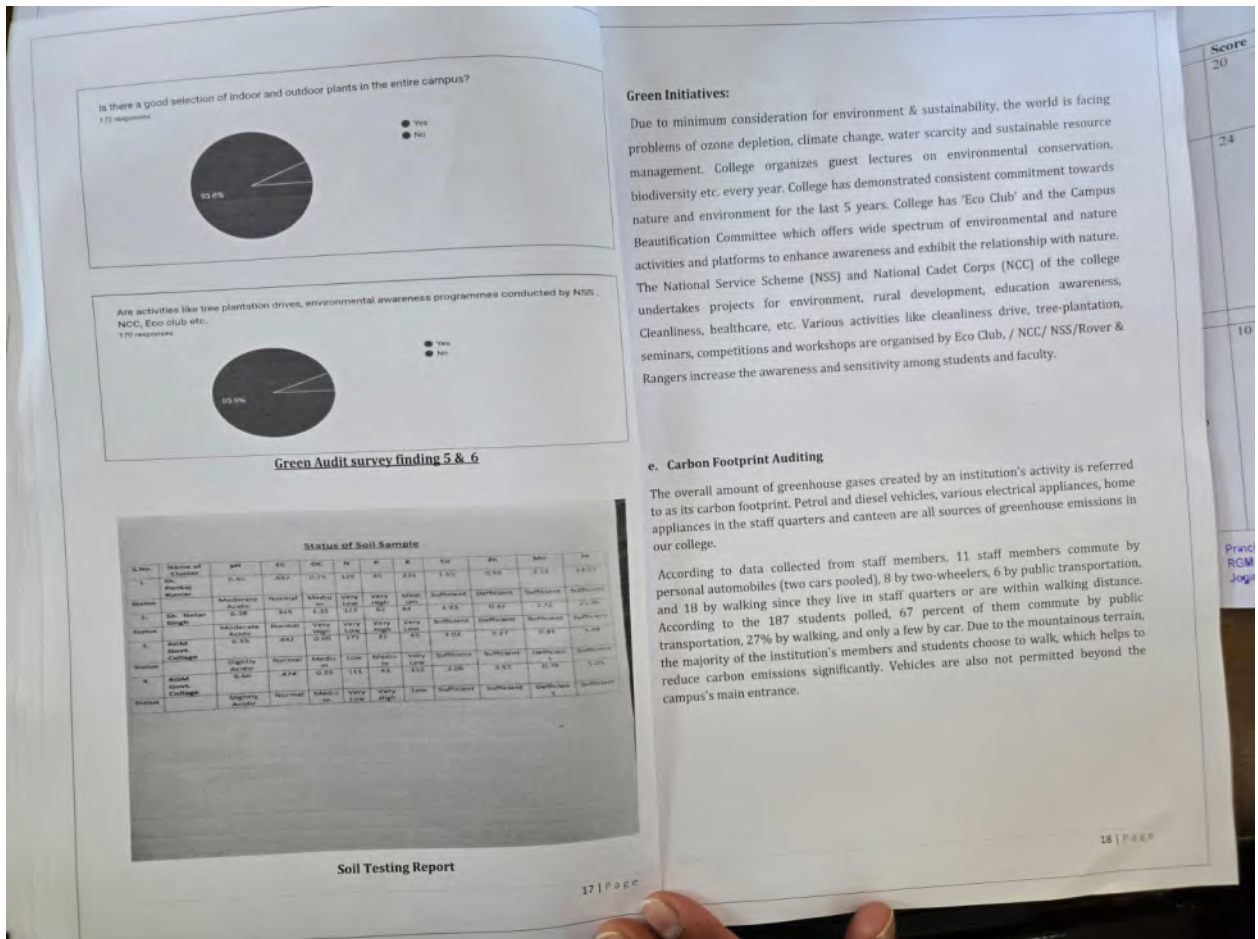

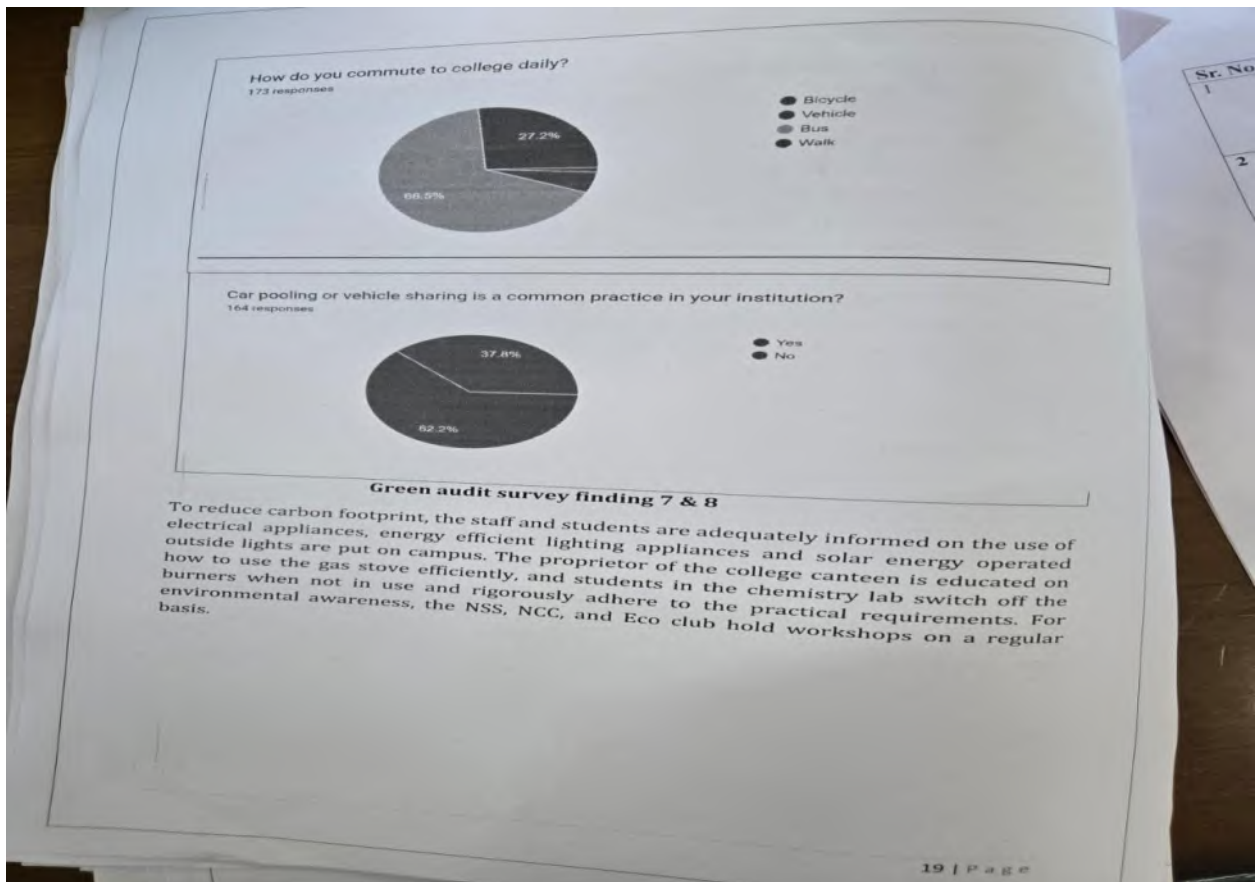
Green Initiatives:

Due to minimum consideration for environment & sustainability, the world is facing problems of ozone depletion, climate change, water scarcity and sustainable resource management. College organizes guest lectures on environmental conservation, biodiversity etc. every year. College has demonstrated consistent commitment towards nature and environment for the last 5 years. College has 'Eco Club' and the Campus Beautification Committee which offers wide spectrum of environmental and nature activities and platforms to enhance awareness and exhibit the relationship with nature. The National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadet Corps (NCC) of the college undertakes projects for environment, rural development, education awareness, Cleanliness, healthcare, etc. Various activities like cleanliness drive, tree-plantation, seminars, competitions and workshops are organised by Eco Club, / NCC/ NSS/Rover & Rangers increase the awareness and sensitivity among students and faculty.

e. Carbon Footprint Auditing

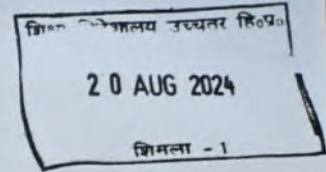
The overall amount of greenhouse gases created by an institution's activity is referred to as its carbon footprint. Petrol and diesel vehicles, various electrical appliances, home appliances in the staff quarters and canteen are all sources of greenhouse emissions in our college.

According to data collected from staff members, 11 staff members commute by personal automobiles (two cars pooled), 8 by two-wheelers, 6 by public transportation, and 18 by walking since they live in staff quarters or are within walking distance. According to the 187 students polled, 67 percent of them commute by public transportation, 27% by walking, and only a few by car. Due to the mountainous terrain, the majority of the institution's members and students choose to walk, which helps to reduce carbon emissions significantly. Vehicles are also not permitted beyond the campus's main entrance.
